St Andrews is the biggest and possibly the most challenging, public golf structure in Europe. As a commendation to its design and history, one of the seven courses, the Old Course, was host to the 2010 British Open championship tournament, an event which draws in the best golfers from all around the world. The Open paid tribute to its 150th anniversary at St Andrews in July 2010. This is the 28th time the Old Course has played host to the Open. St Andrews has gained high admiration from golf stars like Jack Nicklaus and Tiger Woods, both of whom enjoy playing there.

The Old Course frequently is viewed as among the most complex courses in the world to play. There's a narrow line, however, involving difficult and challenging, which better portrays these applauded links. The course has a great amount of large fairways and playable greens, an aspect which might just assist you to earn a respectable score. Nonetheless although the greens and fairways are supremely playable, it's the bunkers and the wind which make the course a true challenge. On a gusty day, the gusts follow you on the beginning nine holes and at your face on the final nine. On the final five holes, don't forget the out-of-bounds that runs down the right side, all set and indulgently waiting to gobble up a slice. The bunkers are an integral aspect that boosts the Old Course's defiance. These involve steep faces which sometimes seem to fly up and snatch your shot. Two bunkers, specially, can attach extra strokes to your score. The first carries the apparent title of Hell and can be found on the fourteenth hole. The second, labelled Road Hole, is equipped to catch wayward shots on the seventeenth. This hole also is looked upon as among the roughest holes in golf and has well-merited reputation. A large number of golfers view Old Course's final three holes to be excellently developed to challenge even the most qualified specialist. The seventeenth hole specially needs two next to impossible drives to arrive at a similarly hard green. Tours are offered at a reasonable price and are a fantastic way to explore the Old Course before making a commitment.
