Two Essential Injuries Influencing Pittsburgh Steelers Just Before Super Bowl

With the Super Bowl less than two weeks away, supposition carries on to rise over which hurt players will come back, which ones will sit out the big game, and which ones are questionable.

Everyone is just observing the Green Bay Packers and the Steelers practice, seeking to get some inside information on which squad will be more well one time the Super Bowl is actually competed.

To start with, Steelers Marukice Pouncey is questionable for playing in the Super Bowl. The Pro Bowl center missed practice on Wednesday due to injuring his ankle. Whilst his position is uncertain at the moment, he's wearing a medical boot and teammate Chris Kemoeatu has claimed that the Pittsburgh steelers will need to find a way to win lacking Pouncey. There has been official word from the squad on Pouncey, though. The Steelers' 2010 No. 1 draft pick had his ankle X-rayed Monday and was fitted for a cast. Pouncey wasn't out there during two open locker room sessions yesterday but was seen at the team's practice facility in a cast and using crutches. Pittsburgh steelers coach Mike Tomlin didn't address the media yesterday.

Pouncey himself hasn't ruled out competing in the [Super Bowl bets](#), but has not indicated one way or the other about his status. He was wounded in the 1st quarter of the Pittsburgh steelers competition versus the Jets, a game which Pittsburgh would go on to win lacking the center. Pouncey has had a comparable injury to his other ankle, so it's quite uncertain whether he'll have the ability to recoup in time.

Defensive end Aaron Smith is also not anticipated to play in the Super Bowl versus the Packers. He has been hurt since late October. The Steelers have not placed Smith on their injured reserve show in the hopes that he could recoup in time. Smith injured his triceps earlier in the year, and could be lacking one of his last odds to play in a Super Bowl game.

The loss of Aaron Smith is not so devastating to the Pittsburgh steelers chances of achievement, nevertheless, as the squad has been playing lacking him for the past few months and have carried out well in the postseason. Losing Pouncey may be a more hard pill to swallow, however, as he had been a element of the defensive line up to the division championship match. Whereas Pittsburgh went on to defeat the Jets devoid of Pouncey, can they do the same vs Green Bay?
